For the past four years, the CGA Senior Two-Man Team Championship has been a "member's only" championship. If your name wasn't Warren Simmons or Tom Reed, your name was not welcome on the championship trophy. Since the event was started in 1988, Simmons has been on three of the four winning teams, twice with Ranch Country Club standout Tom Reed. Simmons' outstanding performances have made some CGA seniors wonder about the CGA executive director's reasoning behind establishing the tournament four years ago. However, in 1992, two commoners from the links of Lakewood Country club made a name for themselves and officially asked Simmons and Reed (not so politely) if they would please pass the Grey Poupon.

This year's tournament, held on June 26-28, over the magnificent Grandote Golf and Country Club course in La Veta, Colorado, witnessed the emergence of Cliff Weiss and Don Eder as the 1992 CGA Senior Two-Man Team Champions. The CGA Senior Two-Man offers different formats in each of the three rounds. The first round is a two-man scramble, the second foursome (Scotch, alternating shots) stroke play and finally fourball (two-man bestball).

Each year it has been the team who can survive the rigors of the foursome of Scotch format who have emerged as champs. This year was no exception as Weiss and Eder posted an even par-72 to grab the lead in the second round. First round leaders Phil Word of Pinehurst and Jack Koennecker of Mountain View skied to an 89 after an opening round 63

to find themselves 15 shots behind. Defending champs Simmons and Reed limped in with an 85, effectively putting a "threepeat" out of reach. The list of scores over 80 reads like a who's-who list of the state's best senior duos. Anderson-Goudey-82, Fowler-Roady-80, Welz-Brethower-83.

With the big names well behind, Weiss and Eder finished with a one-over 73 to win the tournament by three

strokes over John Kaiser of The Meadows Golf Course and Bill Shakespeare of South Suburban Golf Course. Although Kaiser and Shakespeare made a late surge, Weiss and Eder were able to hold on for the win.

In the net division, conducted jointly with the championship flight, the Arvada team of Gil Glaesel and Gerald Palmer came out atop the leaderboard.
